Recommendations: (only required when presented for approval)	That the Board approve the Naming Selection Committee's recommendation that the new North Woodstock public school be named Turtle Island Public School based on the first-choice naming preference of respondents.
Purpose: (include context)	To share with the Board of Trustees, for approval, the Naming Selection Committee's recommended name for the new North Woodstock public school.
Content:	An electronic poll was administered from May 29 to June 27, 2024, to collect rank order preferences of the following potential names for the new North Woodstock public school: • Heritage Public School • North Woodstock Public School • Turtle Island Public Schools Three respondent groups were invited to participate in the naming process poll. This included the parent/caregivers/families of: • Students living in the attendance area established for the new North Woodstock public school; • Students that have Self-Identified as First Nations, Métis and/or Inuit with Thames Valley District School Board; • Students living in First Nations Communities (i.e., Chippewas of the Thames First Nation, Munsee-Delaware Nation, Oneida Nation of the Thames). Individuals voted by paper poll. Community polling opportunities were held on August 20, 2024 for Munsee Delaware Nation, August 22, 2024 for Oneida Nation of the Thames First Nation.
	Respondents had an opportunity to rank order from the list of three names identified by the Naming Selection Committee. Only one vote

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	per family (regardless of the number of children in the same family enrolled at the school) was permitted. Results: • Attendance area families: There were 466 parents/caregivers eligible to participate in the poll. Votes were cast by 226 parents/caregivers or 48% of those eligible to participate. • Families of students that have Self-Identified as First Nations, Métis or Innuit: 133 parent/caregivers out of possible 1388, or 10% participated in the online poll; • First Nations Communities: 31 paper polls were completed by parents/caregivers/families living in the communities. 147 first place votes were cast for Turtle Island Public School. 40 % of the respondents chose Turtle Island Public School as their first choice for a new school name. Number of First Place Votes Received for Each School Name: • Turtle Island Public School – 40% • North Woodstock Public School – 36% • Heritage Public School - 24%
