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Purpose:	To provide an overview of the potential options to balance enrolment in

Content:	Background
Content.	Background
	The catalyst for this review was the growing enrolment pressure at East
	Carling PS, which resulted in the school being capped to new
	registrations for the 2024-25 school year. A boundary change is
	proposed to relieved pressure at East Carling PS, and more
	appropriately utilize Prince Charles PS. The large redevelopment of the
	former Victoria Hospital lands in London within the Aberdeen PS
	attendance area was also a catalyst for this review. Potential boundary changes are proposed for Aberdeen PS to ensure that there will be
	space to accommodate enrolment growth from this development and
	to increase utilization at Trafalgar PS.
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	The Initial Attendance Area Review Report includes potential
	attendance areas for East Carling PS, Prince Charles PS, Aberdeen
	PS, and Trafalgar PS. The potential changes would be implemented
	for the 2026-27 school year.
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	Accommodation Options
	East Carling PS and Prince Charles PS Option (Recommended by Administration)
	The potential option would re-designate the portion of the East Carling PS attendance located between Dundas Street to the north and the Canadian National Railway line to the south to Prince Charles PS. This option balances both schools at close to full capacity.
	Aberdeen PS and Trafalgar PS - Option 1 (Recommended by Administration)
	The first boundary change option would designate the eastern portion of Aberdeen PS's attendance area, including all lands east of Adelaide Street, to Trafalgar PS. This would increase utilization at Trafalgar in 2026-27 from 42% to approximately 66%, which would gradually increase to 70%. Utilization at Aberdeen PS is projected to be approximately 80% by 2029 under this option and remain relatively stable in the following years. The benefit of this option is that it increases the utilization of Trafalgar PS more than Option 2 and creates additional space at Aberdeen PS in the event of higher student yields from the redevelopment of the former Victoria Hospital site.
	Aberdeen PS and Trafalgar PS - Option 2
	Option 2 is similar to Option 1, except that only the portion of land east of Adelaide Street and south of Hamilton Road would be re-designated to Trafalgar PS. This option would result in a projected utilization of 68% at Aberdeen PS, gradually growing to approximately 87%. However, under this option the utilization at Trafalgar PS would be 56%, gradually increasing to 62%.
	Details regarding current and projected enrolments as well as utilizations and attendance area maps are included in Appendix A.
Financial Implications:	The costs to complete the subject Attendance Area Review will be accommodated within the 2024-2025 budget.
Timeline:	The expected timeline if the Board of Trustees approves proceeding with the attendance area review and establishes an Attendance Area Review Committee for the purposes of gathering public feedback is as follows:
