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### WHAT WE ARE AND WHO WE SERVE

- As an integrated part of Ontario's education system, the Education and Community Partnership Program (ECPP) provides critical support to meet the needs of children and youth who cannot attend school due to their primary need for care, treatment and/or rehabilitation services; and facilitates transitions to future educational success.
- We serve youth from all Ontario School Boards that are connected to our community agencies.



## WHAT WE ARE AND WHO WE SERVE

- ECPP's are voluntary collaborative partnerships between Ontario district school boards and government-approved facilities such as children mental health agencies, hospitals, or youth detention centres. District school boards provide the educational component while facilities provide the care and/or treatment or rehabilitation.
- We have 2 identified schools that work alongside different agency partners – Madeline Hardy and WD Sutton.
- We have 10 different locations, ranging from Parkhill, Springfield and within the city of London.



Three Essential Components of ECPP Education Programs

Students in our ECPP classrooms are taught by Thames Valley District School Board teachers and follow the Ontario Curriculum.

We have programs from Kindergarten through Grade 12.



Three Essential Components of ECPP Education Programs

Due to the unique needs of students in ECPPs, the Ministry has identified three essential components for the education component of an ECPP:

1. Instruction and Intervention

2. Assessment, Evaluation and Reporting on Educational Achievement

3. Transition Planning - back into their community schools
